Explanations for significant variances compared to the previous fiscal year

Total expenditures for travel, hospitality and conferences decreased compared to the 2018-19 fiscal year.

Travel: Travel expenditures mainly decreased in 2019-20 due to less operational activity travel related to national education programs than what was offered by the Museum in 2018-19. The reduction in training-related travel costs was due to an increased focus on conferences and professional development available locally.

Hospitality: There was no significant variance in hospitality expenditures compared to the 2018-19 fiscal year.

Conference fees: Conference fees decreased in 2019-20 due to lower participation in conferences for purposes of promoting the Museum and fewer staff attending conferences on highly specialized topics.
