Explanations for significant variances compared to the previous fiscal year

The expenditures for each category, travel, hospitality and conferences have increased compared to 2022-23 fiscal year due to continuing recovery from the impact of the COVID-19 global pandemic. Expense increases came in the areas of exhibitions and program development, engagement with main stakeholders, the public consultations required to develop the Museum's new strategic plan and conference participation, both to promote the Museum and to invest in professional development.
