

Points of View: A National Human Rights Photography Exhibition is a powerful visual array of diverse perspectives and experiences captured by photographers from across Canada.

Under the themes of Reconciliation, Human Rights and the Environment, Freedom of Expression, and Inclusion and Diversity, these 70 juried photographs tell stories of passion and protest, family and friendship, suffering and struggle, hunger and hope. Five award-winning images were also turned into three-dimensional, tactile displays, making them accessible through touch and sound to visitors who are blind or have low vision.



Space requirements

370 to 470 square metres (4,000 to 5,000 square feet). A scalable version can be adapted to a smaller footprint.

Components

- Five award-winning photographs and 65 additional photographs (matted and framed).
- Five tactile photographic displays with sensors for audio narration (speakers included).
- · Bilingual text (French/English).
- Design files for all exhibition text and environmental graphics (includes title treatment, introductory statement, jury statements, photograph captions, juror biographies and overall exhibition graphic identity).
- · Remote IT/AV support.
- Sample news release and social media posts available upon request.

Venue requirements

- Provision of installation technicians.
- Security on site during public access for equipment safekeeping.
- A clean, pest-free dedicated exhibition area free from food and drink.
- No specific temperature or humidity requirements.

Accessibility

Included are sculpted 3D tactile images of the five award-winning photographs, created by 3DPhotoWorks in collaboration with the CMHR, accompanied by audio image descriptions. These reproductions enable visitors who are blind or have low vision to experience the photographs through touch and sound. All CMHR exhibitions follow inclusive design standards facilitating interaction by visitors of all abilities.

Duration

Twelve-week suggested minimum.

Optional services

Exhibition layout design services can be provided by the CMHR for an additional cost.

Rental fee

Full exhibition: \$15,000 CDN for 12-week run plus pro-rated shipping costs.
